2. MU June Leadership Conference

Instead of the MU Annual Gathering this year, MU is holding a conference for MU leaders in B&I to focus on membership growth and our upcoming 150th year celebrations. Taking a break from an annual gathering this year for members, means that next year's one will be welcomed, and hopefully busy! All dioceses were invited to send one or two representatives to attend. It takes place at Liverpool Hope University, where we held the joyous Reimagining MU Conference in 2022. Your WWP, Kathleen Snow is joining us as she focuses her first year on B&I, nurturing, growing, and securing the movement for the future as part of the triennium theme

3. Church Based Membership

This launches over the next two months, and is a member-driven idea that came out of the Reimagining MU process to help arrest the rapid decline in membership in B&I. It is an opportunity for local dioceses to ask churches where there is no MU presence, or a branch is recently closed, to take up our new membership subscription. The church will receive a package of resources and support and an opportunity for their parishioners to engage in local MU programmes and to fundraise for MU, all for an annual contribution to MU. It is hoped that this new way of engaging the 75% of churches that do not benefit from MU will help churches in their ministry, increase interest in MU and lead to more groups forming.

4. 150th Year Celebrations!

The June Leadership Conference is focused on preparations for 2026. National initiatives from the central charity include:

- the MU National Celebratory Service at St Pauls' Cathedral on the evening of 10th June 2026, and,
- the MU Annual Gathering on 11th June 2026, at the Emmanuel Centre next door to Mary Sumner House
